HERE FOR BUSINESS

- > 250 jobs created in 13 businesses across Baw Baw, Wellington and Latrobe City shires through Regional Development Victoria.
- > 11 businesses have claimed back a wide range of state and local government fees and charges through the Economic Growth Zone.
- > 302 people employed through the Back To Work Scheme.
- > 43 local businesses in Hazelwood Power Station's supply chain supported to plan for a new future.



HERE FOR COMMUNITY



- > 7 major sporting facilities to be upgraded; a calendar of major events and community programs. Includes major sporting events such as the NBL Blitz, W-League friendly match and Big Bash League T20 cricket pre-season game.
- > 24 community groups from Latrobe City, Wellington and Baw Baw shires have received more than \$1.2 million in Community Facility Fund grants.
- > Renovations complete at the Latrobe Regional Gallery, enabling it to host its first major international exhibition.
- > Good Money outlet open in Morwell providing access to zero or low-interest loans, financial counselling and affordable insurance.

HERE FOR WORKERS

- > 957 people are being supported through the Worker Transition Service, a partnership between LVA, GEST, Workways, Skills and Jobs Centre and Gippsland Trades and Labour Council.
- > 48 former Hazelwood employees have secured employment with other power generators as a result of the Worker Transfer Scheme.
- > Launch of the Access New Industries Program to help clients and their families access employment in our region's growing health sector.


